The Oxfordshire Partnership

- The over-arching strategic partnership for the county

Purpose:

- ensure county organisations work together effectively
- develop a VISION for the next 25-30 years (Sustainable Community Strategy)
- make sure we deliver outcomes that improve people's lives (e.g. Local Area Agreement Targets).

What is a Sustainable Community Strategy?

- Long term vision (20+ years)
- Describes what is important about Oxfordshire to Government and external agencies
- A Partnership plan
- Short/medium/long term targets
- Measure progress

Local Area Agreement

- an agreement, drawn up between a local area and central government
- setting priorities, both national and local
- a statement of commitment from all partners to meet targets.
- a 3 year action plan to improve outcomes.
- Districts, PCT, Police, Job Centre + all have a “duty to co-operate”.

Developing the strategy

- Evidence and data
- Workshops – Implications for Oxfordshire / issues and options for the strategy
- Full Council debate (last Sept and wider consultation on issues and options
- Partnership agreed priorities
- Drafting strategy
- Public consultation on the draft strategy

What's in Oxfordshire's LAA?

National priorities, e.g.

- ✓ reducing 16-18 NEETs
- ✓ CO2 reductions
- ✓ teenage conception rates
- ✓ net additional homes
- ✓ re-offending rates

Local priorities e.g.

- ✓ Improved street and environmental cleanliness
- ✓ Reducing under 18 conception rates
- ✓ Reducing number of working age people on out of work benefits
- ✓ Adapting to climate change



Oxfordshire 2030 (long-term vision)

- **A World Class Economy**
- **Healthy and thriving communities**
- **Environment and climate change**
- **Reducing inequalities and breaking the cycle of deprivation.**
- Priorities are based on a firm analysis of evidence.

A World Class Economy

We pledge to:

- Collaborate across public, business and voluntary sectors to build on Oxfordshire's economic success
- Create the conditions for everyone to have access to jobs
- Ensure that educational attainment and skills levels are amongst the best in country so we provide a well qualified, motivated workforce to meet the needs of business
- Achieve a sustainable balance between jobs, housing and environment
- Tackle traffic congestion particularly on trunk roads and around Oxford City and other hotspots

Healthy and Thriving Communities

We pledge to:

- Work to sustain local services particularly in rural communities
- Ensure the provision of more affordable housing
- Tackle crime and anti-social behaviour
- Work to reduce, isolate, prevent and defeat violent extremism
- Promote healthy lifestyles
- Shift the emphasis of public services to prevention
- Work to sustain local services particularly in rural communities
- Ensure every child gets every opportunity for a good start in life
- Work with local communities to sustain and build supportive....and well-planned communities

Environment and Climate Change

We pledge to:

- Reduce the carbon emissions from public sector organisations and to set an example for businesses and others in the county
- Reduce waste and increase re-use and recycling by households and businesses
- Minimise the effects and risk of flooding
- Ensure new development is built to high environmental standards
- Promote efficient use of water and energy
- Keep Oxfordshire clean and green
- Preserve and enhance the biodiversity of the county



Reducing inequalities and breaking the cycle of deprivation

We pledge to:

- Reduce the gap between the best and worst off
- Increase educational attainment and skill levels
- Tackle crime and anti-social behaviour “hot spots”
- Regenerate deprived local communities

The Delivery Plan

Developing specific and measurable **targets** for the next 3 years and **objectives** for the longer-term. Includes :

1. Improvement targets for the next 3 years (the **Local Area Agreement 2008-2011**).
2. **Local** targets and priorities agreed by the partnership which are not being measured by the Government.
3. Targets from the current Local Area Agreement which (2006-2009)

Consultation Responses

- 12 week period of consultation:
7th July – 22nd September
 - Councillors (District, County and Parish)
 - Private sector
 - Voluntary and Community Sector
 - Town and Parish Councils
 - County Council Staff
 - Hard to reach groups
 - Public
 - District Local Strategic Partnerships
 - Thematic Partnerships
- 60 responses received
- Minor changes were proposed to the text, language, grammar and design
- Additions to the text were proposed on issues respondents felt were either not included or considered insufficiently clear
- Clarification of issues and processes
- Clarification of how respondents could get involved in the work of the partnership



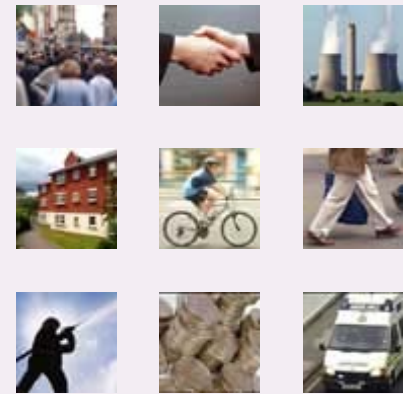
Next Steps:
