



## **Consultation on the draft version of the sustainable community strategy: Oxfordshire 2030**

### **Introduction**

This document captures the consultation feedback we received on the first draft version of the sustainable community strategy: Oxfordshire 2030. It indicates whether that feedback was included in the consultation draft, and if it was not, why. There are further opportunities to challenge and influence the strategy during the public consultation phase in January and February 2008.

### **Criteria**

We have responded to comments against the following principles and criteria :

The sustainable community strategy sets out high level and long-term aims and priorities.

- It is “owned” by all the organisations represented on its Board and is a partnership plan and not a County Council plan. The role of the Oxfordshire Partnership and the Strategy is to add value by doing things that can only be achieved if several organisations work together towards agreed goals with the objective of improving the quality of life of people everywhere in the county. The Partnership has no statutory powers. It is not there to do the job of local authorities or any other organisation or sector that participates and supports the community leadership role of elected members.

The Local Area Agreement with Government sets out our short-term (3 year) targets that contribute to the long-term aims.

- These will often have a local as well as a county-wide dimension. For example: reducing anti-social behaviour can affect any local community and requires localised as well as more generalised and strategic responses.

In considering the consultation responses we have indicated whether :

- Local issues are relevant to the strategy or are more relevant to local district community strategies and district local strategic partnerships.
- Proposals are relevant to the Local Area Agreement.
- The issue is not relevant to the role and purpose of the Oxfordshire Partnership and the Strategy – for example: where it is primarily the role of a statutory local authority.
