## **OXFORDSHIRE PUBLIC SERVICE BOARD - 2 SEPTEMBER 2009**

### **DECISIONS ON THE PROPOSALS FOR THE USE OF THE 50% OF THE PERFORMANCE REWARD GRANT HELD BY THE PUBLIC SERVICE BOARD.**

#### **Recommendations**

1. The recommendations for each bid are listed in the table below.
2. The current proposals do not evenly balance capital and revenue expenditure. Bidders shall be mindful of the requirement to do so, and if seeking to do otherwise, in order to achieve the aims of their bid, then they must provide a justification together with an illustration of what can be achieved if the 50% capital / 50% revenue split is adhered to.
3. Not all reward grant is allocated at this stage and the PSB shall consider further allocations in the future.

<b>Breaking the Cycle Deprivation</b>	£500k	£500k	<p><b>AGREED</b> subject to further work by 5 Chief Execs Group to</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Tighten focus, scope and clarify outcomes.</li> <li>• Balance capital / revenue spend.</li> <li>• Ensure that areas of deprivation are based on the most deprived Super Output Areas (as ward level data can mask pockets of high deprivation).</li> </ul> <p>It is proposed that the Group shall report on progress to the PSB on 18 November.</p>
<b>Becoming a World Class Economy</b>	£500k	£500k	<p>The PSB <b>AGREED</b> that up to £1M shall continue to be allocated against this priority. However, the existing bid was NOT AGREED in its current format. Board members expressed concern about the over reliance on the creation of new posts and the sustainability of projects in the current financial climate given that this is one-off grant. It was agreed that the Chief Executives Group should review the current bid with the OEP and the OL&amp;SP and report back to the next meeting with a progress report including a timetable for completion of revised proposals which should address practical help to local businesses to tackle the recession and reflect the evidence base of need emerging from the economic assessment.</p> <p>Chief Executives were asked to ensure that :</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The OEP/OL&amp;SP clarify the proposed use of the 50% of reward grant going direct to the partners for skills projects.</li> <li>• That the bid reflected early findings in the Oxfordshire economic assessment.</li> <li>• The bid aims to improve outcomes for deprived communities and groups</li> <li>• The final bid clearly articulates outcomes and demonstrates sustainability.</li> <li>• The bid achieves 50/50 capital/revenue spend balance.</li> <li>• That the outcomes proposed in the Skills Build and Business in the Community bids are considered as part of this process.</li> </ul>

<b>Climate change Amalgamated bid from partnership.</b>	£250k	£250k	<b>AGREED</b> subject to sign off by the Environment & Waste Partnership to ensure that the proposed development work with schools is <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• over and above any other climate change / schools initiatives and</li> <li>• Is targeted at schools in most deprived areas.</li> <li>• And that the Energy Incentive Scheme is targeted to areas of high fuel poverty and/or most deprived areas.</li> </ul>
<b>Safer Communities</b>	£250k	£250k	<b>AGREED</b> subject to there being further challenge within the OSCP/CDRPs/partners organisations to ensure that this bid and the 50% of reward going direct to partners is aligned with the OSCP and Oxfordshire 2030 priorities.
<b>Grant pot for voluntary and community sector</b>	£250k	£250k	<b>Members AGREED to reserve £500k for a grant pot</b> for the voluntary and community sector but expressed concern about the level of expenditure proposed for administration of the scheme. It was suggested that the administration could be undertaken by existing staff in local authorities on behalf of the OCVA in order to maximise funds going direct to front line projects in voluntary organisations. The Chief Executive's group were authorised to agree a way forward with OCVA and report back at the next meeting where a final decision will be made. This would also enable Alison Baxter (who could not be present at this meeting) to be present to discuss the proposal.
<b>Understanding the needs of vulnerable communities in Oxfordshire</b>	£40k	£60k	<b>NOT AGREED, however, the PSB requested that OSCA and the LAA Steering group have further discussions</b> about this bid and bring a proposal back to the November 18 PSB that clarifies aims and outcomes, and how this links in with other existing groups across the county. It was agreed that Alison Baxter (who could not be present at this meeting) should have the opportunity to present the bid at the meeting.

<b>Business in the Community</b>	<b>NOT AGREED</b> but proposed that the OEP/OL&SP shall review whether this can be included within the World Class Economy bid and/or through the 50% of LAA reward going direct to partners.		
<b>Reducing health inequalities – mental health.</b>	<b>NOT AGREED</b> but proposed that Health and Well-being Partnership give further consideration to the outcomes set out in this bid for the 50% of LAA reward grant funding going direct to the partnership.
