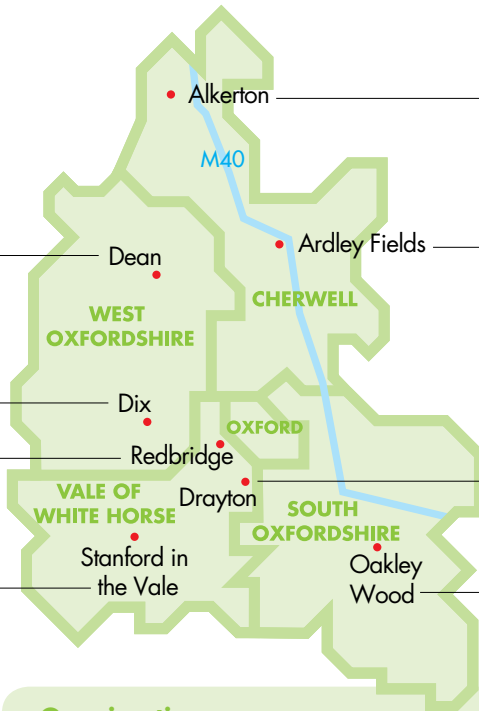
# Now you can recycle small electrical items -



*Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment (WEEE) regulations were introduced in 2007 and affect us all. We can now recycle our small electrical items.*

like radios and microwaves, as well as large household items, such as fridges and washing machines, at any of our Waste Recycling Centres.

- Chadlington OX7 3JY**  
1 mile west of Chadlington village, signposted off the A44 at Enstone
- Stanton Harcourt OX29 5BB**  
South west of Stanton Harcourt village, signposted off A415 and B4449
- Oxford OX1 4XG**  
In the south of the City, off the Abingdon road, behind Redbridge Park & Ride
- Stanford in the Vale SN7 8LD**  
Off the A417, 0.75 miles north west of Stanford in the Vale village



**Alkerton OX15 6HZ**

7 miles west of Banbury, signposted off the A422 Stratford road, north of Alkerton village

**Ardley OX27 7PH**

Near Bicester just off the B430, 1 mile south of Ardley village

**Drayton OX14 4LA**

Near Abingdon directly off the B4017, south of Drayton village, next to A34 flyover

**Crowmarsh OX10 6PW**

Signposted off the A4130 Nettlebed road, 1.5 miles east of Wallingford

## Opening times

Monday to Sunday, 8am-5pm, all year.  
Late night opening on Thursdays until 8pm between 1st April and 30th September.

## Here are some examples of the items we can take for recycling

- ✓ **clocks and watches**
- ✓ **computers and laptops**
- ✓ **cookers**
- ✓ **electric heaters**
- ✓ **fluorescent tubes**
- ✓ **fridges and freezers**
- ✓ **games consoles**
- ✓ **hairdryers**
- ✓ **irons**
- ✓ **low energy light bulbs (but not light fittings)**
- ✓ **microwaves**
- ✓ **monitors**
- ✓ **radios**
- ✓ **shaving equipment**
- ✓ **stereos and CD/DVD players**
- ✓ **telephones and mobiles**
- ✓ **televisions**
- ✓ **toasters**
- ✓ **vacuum cleaners**
- ✓ **washing machines**

## How do I get the bulky items recycled?

The larger items such as fridges, freezers and washing machines can also be taken away by your local District Council (some councils charge for this service). Contact details can be found on the back page.

## What about light bulbs?

Fluorescent tubes and the new low energy bulbs go into a separate container at the Recycling Centre. Unfortunately, the traditional filament bulbs can't be recycled.

## What happens to WEEE?

WEEE items are taken for refurbishment wherever possible. Anything that cannot be reused is taken to be stripped down into component parts and these materials are then sent to be turned into the raw materials used for making new items.

Some companies offer an in-store take-back of electrical items on a like-for-like basis. If you purchase a new electrical item, these stores will dispose of your old item for you.

### What does this symbol mean?

Newer products are marked with the crossed-out wheeley bin to remind people to recycle them.

### I am a trader - how can I recycle my old electrical items?

The Waste Recycling Centres are for use by householders only and cannot accept waste from commercial sources. However, small businesses and traders have a Duty of Care under this scheme, which means they also have to comply with the WEEE regulations. To find out more, contact us on 08450 504550.

### Who pays for all these items to be recycled?

As part of the new regulations, manufacturers are responsible for paying for refurbishing or recycling their old electronic and electrical goods.
